Aim: To come back at home with understanding and skills in order to go further with a good idea; and with the written detailed protocol from the idea participants came with.

Objectives: The own, ongoing research project is the essential part of the training. To help participants to formulate ideas that can be tested in a scientific manner,

- Literature search
- Once a good research question formulated, how to choose the appropriate method
- Explanations on paradigms of qualitative and quantitative research.
- Fundamentals in statistics
- Quantitative and qualitative sampling techniques, sample sizes, bias
- And all the things to think when wanting to set up a feasible research project

Target group: Primary health care workers who are considering setting up a local research project and wanting to dedicate some time to research.

Course Language: International English, with two French EGPRN members to help for understanding

Number of participants: limited to 25

Description of the Course:

The course is designed to achieve a balance between theoretical and practical learning, and between conceptual and factual materials. There is teaching with regular breaks and adequate discussion time within small groups after each didactic session. Laptops are necessary.

The curriculum is based on previous international EGPRN course and is given by primary health care researchers.
